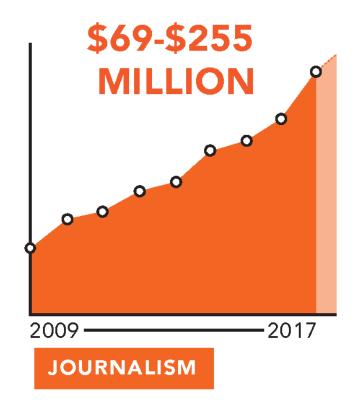




JOURNALISM GRANTS TO US-BASED ORGANIZATIONS, 2009-2017

Journalism funding has nearly quadrupled since 2009.

























































*Totals may add up to more than 100% because grants can be assigned to more than one category

Since 2009, 3,106 funders gave \$1.7 billion in journalism-related grants.







































Community foundations are critical to healthy information flows.

- Since 2009, 114 community foundations gave \$68.5 million of the \$1.7 billion or 5 percent.
- The top 10 community foundations that give journalism grants made \$44.2 million in grants, 64 percent of total grants.

















































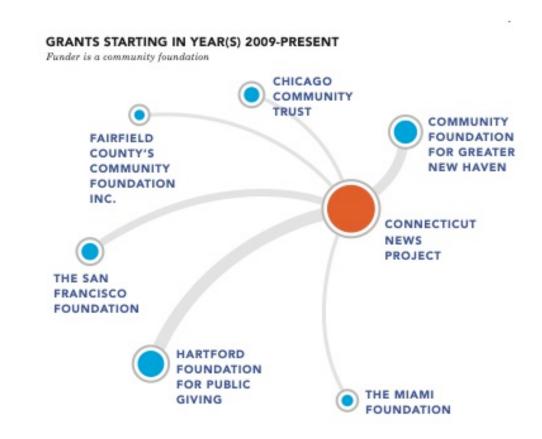






Visualizing the connections

 One of the best features of our data map is the Constellation feature (pictured at right), which shows how funders are connected around a specific topic.



















































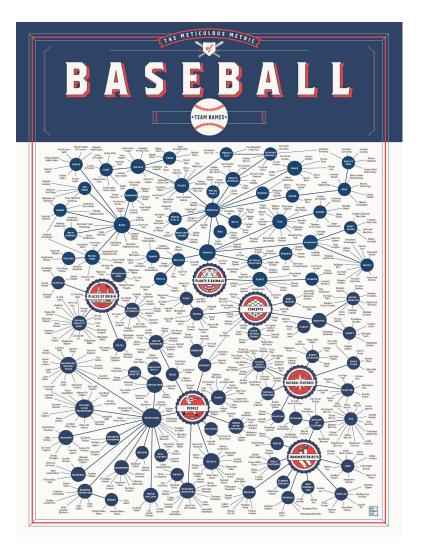

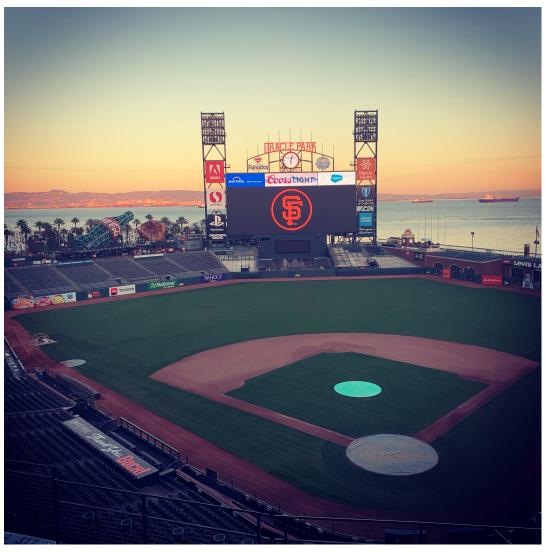
